**OBJECTIVES**

**1. Reduce the current rate of prison recidivism**

In Massachusetts, more than six out of ten people return to prison within six months to three years after release from custody. Join us in our efforts to develop programs and to access existing help networks that will increase the potential for successful re-entry.

**2. Rebuild families and communities**

We are concerned about the effects that both incarceration and post-prison return have on families. We welcome you to help us in our efforts to strengthen the family by preparing them for the return of their loved ones. We seek to help families stay connected or to reconnect. We provide direct assistance through our volunteers and referrals.

**3. Improve employment and housing opportunities**

We are committed to help secure sustainable jobs and stable housing to those returning from prison. Good housing and employment are essential to fulfilling the hopes and dreams of these

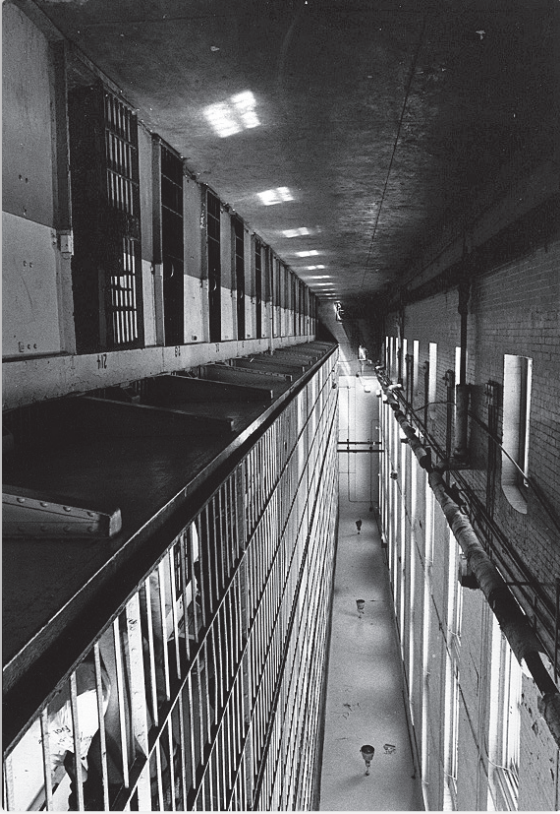
